BEST BET: Race 6 - #7 Maraud

This lightly race 2-year-old colt has quite the resume for only having had two career starts. He broke his maiden at first asking at Saratoga and then came back with a big performance to be third in the G3 Pilgrim, beaten by just half a length. One of many strong horses in Todd Pletcher's arsenal on today's card, this son of Blame has been training well at Palm Beach Downs in preparation.

LONGSHOT: Race 5 - #6 Stronger

After debuting with an okay fourth place finish, this colt found his home going a longer distance when he broke his maiden at a mile in August. After that, not only was he immediately asked to step up into G1 company in the Champagne, but he also ran against eventual BC Juvenile winner Good Magic and other strong horses. He's been training sharply since returning to FL and the blinkers go on.
