He has an abundance of early speed and an inside post, and it seems that jockey Emisael Jaramillo knows exactly how to handle this tough horse.

LONGSHOT: Race 1 - #6 Siem Riep

This is a horse who might be overlooked in the wagering in this wide open first race, but he comes out of a key race against very tough competition. Sandwiched in between two next out winners, this gelding by Tapit has quite a bit of early speed and seems to like the GP turf.
