BEST BET: Race 4 - #5 Wild Good

Looking at this race on paper, it seems to go through Wild Good and Trouble in Phoenix. To his benefit, Wild Good has been consistently running on the main track, and sprinting. Although it's been a while since he last won, his dirt numbers are superior to anything that he faces here. In addition, I think this elongated sprint of 7 furlongs should be a suitable distance for him, and he'll be more forwardly placed.

LONGSHOT: Race 8 - #8 Burning Wild

There seems to be quite a bit of speed signed on in here, and while All Go looks to be the most logical winner based on class, I look for Burning Wild to be the one who will benefit most if the pace falls apart. A horse we're well familiar with in South Florida, this tough gelding is always right there and can be seen doing his best running late. Since being claimed by Jorge Navarro, he notched that third career victory a few races back, and is now returning to his preferred surface.
