BEST BET: Race 3 - #3 Tiz From Boston

First off the claim for trainer Victor Barboza Jr. (whose numbers with this move are an impressive 38% this year), this is a horse I've been chasing in his last few starts. He's actually only run once on grass, and on five other occasions found himself in a race that was taken off the turf. It does appear that dirt is his better surface, and that is where the new connections keep him. He also picks up Emisael Jaramillo, who piloted him to his maiden score with the previous connections.

LONGSHOT: Race 7 - #1 Queens Quarters

Getting back on the turf and taking a significant drop in class, this filly looks to be back in a spot where she can be successful. Scrolling through her past performances, she won by 6 and 1/4 lengths the last time she ran at this level of competition, and it was also at this distance. She also has a nice closing kick, which should be to her benefit in this race, where there are several speed types assembled.
